KOINS FOR KENYA

Koins expands the basic educational experience, preparing students for the real world. We assist the village with basic materials so they can provide for themselves for today and well into the future. The future of these rural villagers depends upon the education of their children. Without education, they have no opportunities and the cycle of poverty continues.

VILLAGE FACTS

- The average income is less than \$250
- Life expectancy is less than 43 years
- No homes in our villages enjoy running water, electricity or telephone service
- No one owns a car in our villages
- The average primary school class size is 90 pupils per teacher
- Our students have never felt ice, been in an elevator or visited a mall. They have no TV's, radios, iPods or computers.



- However, our students understand calculus, physics, biology and engineering... and each of them speak 3-4 languages.



Koins for Kenya is a 501(c)3 humanitarian organization that has worked in Kenya since 2003. Because our administration and fundraising is done by volunteers, we are able to channel donations directly to the work we do in Kenya. Any donation you make will be utilized for the improvement of a community that desperately needs your help.

Koins' efforts are currently centralized in rural villages along the eastern coast of Kenya, near Mombasa. Our main goal has been education, building classrooms, and providing scholarships for high achieving secondary school and university students. We also focus on water, health, farming, microbusiness and sanitation needs.

Koins for Kenya requires the local communities be highly mobilized, providing at least 10% of all necessary project funds, and all of the unskilled labor through villager participation.
